RE: Restoration of power to City of Coral Gables residents

Mr. Bryan:

Today is the sixth day since the passing of Hurricane Irma in the South Florida area and still a substantial and inordinate number of City of Coral Gables residents and businesses unjustifiably remain without power. This poses a significant public safety concern, particularly because of the high summer temperatures and the lack of air conditioning, bringing this matter within the City's police power. It is evident that Florida Power and Light (FPL) was inadequately prepared to respond to this storm and this is particularly concerning in light of the fact that the storm ultimately brought significantly slower winds than predicted.

As directed by the City Commission and on behalf of the City's residents and businesses, FPL is hereby ordered to restore power throughout the City by Sunday, September 17<sup>th</sup> at 11:45 p.m. This deadline is consistent with FPL's commitment that power will be restored along the East coast of Florida by then.

In addition, FPL has not adequately responded to situations involving downed or low power lines, particularly where such downed or low lines are in trees that have fallen in the right-of-way. The City is not permitted to clear trees from the right-of-way that have a downed or low power line, as the power line must first be removed by FPL. This situation poses a dangerous hazard to the community, and prevents the City from being able to clear the right-of-way of the tree because of the existence of the power line, which again brings the matter within the City's police power. This must be remedied by 5pm today.

Failure to comply with this letter will subject FPL to a fine of \$500 per day consistent with Section 2-203 of the City of Coral Gables Code and fines up to \$15,000 consistent with Section 162.09, Florida Statutes.

The City reserves the right to seek cumulative or additional remedies including filing a complaint with the Florida Public Service Commission.
