

**ORDINANCE C-471**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF MEDLEY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2 "ADMINISTRATION", ARTICLE I. – IN GENERAL, TO PROVIDE FOR, SET AND CAP THE ANNUAL COMPENSATION TO MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS AS PROVIDED IN THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023/2024; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, Article III. Government, Section 8, of the Town of Medley Charter provides that the compensation of the Mayor and council members shall be prescribed by Ordinance and fixed in the annual budget; and

**WHEREAS**, the Council adopted Ordinance C-424 on November 6, 2017 and wishes to, as part of the budgetary approval process for fiscal year 2023/2024, implement and set an annual compensation for the Mayor and Councilmembers; and

**WHEREAS**, this Ordinance shall amend and supersede any prior legislation and shall prescribe the annual compensation for the Mayor in the amount of \$ 230,871.72 and for Councilmembers in the amount of \$ 59,879.53 as fixed and as provided for in the Budget for fiscal year 2023/2024; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to law, notice has been given by publication in a paper of general circulation in the Town, notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of the public hearings; and

**WHEREAS**, two (2) public hearings before the Town Council were held pursuant to the published notice described above.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MEDLEY, FLORIDA, HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.**     **Recitals Adopted.** Each of the above recitals is hereby confirmed and adopted.

**Section 2.** That Chapter 2 "Administration" of the Town of Medley Code of Ordinances, is hereby amended as follows:

## **Chapter 2 - ADMINISTRATION**

### **ARTICLE I. – IN GENERAL**

#### Sec. 2-1. - Compensation Mayor and Council Members.

The annual compensation for the Mayor and Council Members has been set forth and fixed in the amount of \$ 230,871.72 and \$ 59,879.53 respectively, as reflected in the budget for fiscal year 2023/2024 effective October 1, 2023. These amounts shall be capped at their present rates and shall not increase or be subject to any raises, cost of living, or any other increases.

**Section 3. Codification.** It is the intent of the Town Council that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Town's Code of Ordinances, and that the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," "regulation," or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.

**Section 4. Repealer.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances, resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.


**Section 5. Severability.** The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance but they shall remain in effect, it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

**Section 6. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption on second reading.


